Key Dates

November 2021	Next Steps Committee approved by the Board of Education
February 2022	The Committee will meet to review current enrollment trends and projections, review current and projected capacity at each school building, and set goals for our future planning.
April 2022	The Committee will reconvene to begin future planning discussions.
October 2022	The Committee will review new school year enrollment, continue future planning discussions, and begin developing Committee recommendation. (Task Forces will present plans)
January 2023	The Next Steps Committee will complete their recommendation. This recommendation will be shared with the Board of Education at the January Board of Education Meeting for consideration.
